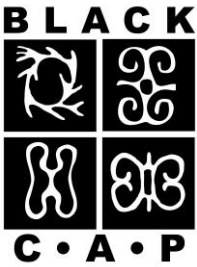

Experience in developing and delivering training in-person and virtually is essential, as is experience in producing evidence-informed programming and utilizing a community development approach in the work. We are looking for someone who takes great pride in their work, shows attention to detail, uses a broad-minded approach to the work, and is able to work independently and as part of a team. They will bring enthusiasm and a collaborative spirit to the work.

1. Post-secondary degree in a relevant discipline or combination of post-secondary diploma, lived experience and related experience.
2. At least three years developing, delivering and evaluating interactive, in-person and digital HIV and/or health-related curricula for adult learners, to support continuing education and professional development.
3. Ability to assess the validity of information, and to synthesize and clearly communicate complex information from a variety of sources.
4. Understanding of HIV/AIDS issues within African, Caribbean and Black (ACB) communities and demonstrated experience working with ACB communities in Canada.
